The Museum tells the story of **the Foundling Hospital**, Britain's first home for children who had been abandoned by their mothers, usually due to extreme poverty. Find out how the "lucky babies" were selected and what their early upbringing would have been like.







The Foundling Hospital's Collection includes works of art by some of Britain's most prominent eighteenth-century artists such as Hogarth, Gainsborough, Joshua Reynolds and Louis-Francois Roubiliac, donated by the artists themselves.
